1. Feral & Community Cat Colonies Issue- Alachua County Assistant County Manager Ms. Gena Peebles & Mr. Ed Williams Alachua County Animal Control

Mr. Ed Williams explained the Community Cat Management Program. How they trap, sterilize and vaccinate the cats and then return them back to the community they come from.

Ms. Jennifer (Last name exempt) explained the issues she's having with the feral cats. Fleas, urinating on her dog bed, damaging her property and she and her dog have been scratched trying to trap the feral cats. She is publically requesting the cats be removed from her property and not returned.

Mr. Luke Smith (Operation Cat Nip) the goal is zero outdoor cats. Operation Cat Nip offers free spray and neutering. In order to make this successful everyone has to help.

Mr. Samuel Ford- Live in Lake Breeze and he can hear the cats breeding in the wooded area across from his home.

Mrs. Tammy Scott- Issue with the cats have been happening for 28 years because that is how long she has lived in the Ashley Oaks subdivision. She agree with Mr. Luke Smith about trapping the cats. By doing this the cat colony near her home is fed and well taken care of.

Ms. Angela Fisher- explained the issue she's had with the feral cats at her home in Ashley Oaks. They have damaged her vehicle and her guest vehicle, break flower pots on her porch, killed birds, etc.

Mr. Larry Tilbury- Neutering does not solve all the problems. Cats are very destructive and he don't want cats on his property because he don't own cats. The City need to be more pro-active if Alachua County don't fix the problem.

Ms. Jessica Carroll- Cats poop in her vegetable garden and scratches her car.

Mr. Gilbert Randall- That is his biggest problem with the cats in his area. They always poop in his garden.

The discussion on the feral cat issue continued with the City Commission and County Staff. The City Commission suggested having a community workshop on this issue in the near future.
